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CTI Site Survey Results 3 out of 4 Sites around the World Prefer CTI to Other CROs

CTI prides itself on having strong relationships with important clinical research sites around the world. An independent consultant was commissioned to run a site satisfaction survey earlier this year, which was sent to over 2,400 investigators, pharmacists, study coordinators and other site personnel around the world. Responses came back from all over the US as well as Canada, France, Italy, Spain, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany, Czech Republic, and Japan.

Sites were asked to rank their satisfaction with CTI across a range of areas, including confidentiality, responsiveness, communication, competence, and continuity. Overall, three out of four sites prefer CTI over all other Clinical Research Organizations (CROs), and nearly 95% of respondents view CTI as equal to or better than other CROs that they have recently worked with. Some of the comments received from the sites include:

- "CTI is currently the best CRO we work with!"
- "I wish I had CTI for all my clinical trials!"
- "CTI is among the best CROs I have ever worked with! I find that CTI sets the bar; some other CROs are able to reach it but not all."
- "CTI is rated as the most qualified and competent CRO that we work with."
- "I've told a number of folks that CTI has been the best CRO I have ever worked with."

The sites surveyed are especially satisfied with CTI's therapeutic expertise and drug development knowledge. When asked what they like most about CTI's clinical expertise, one response was, "Knowledge of trial and of site. When they are here, they know our site so well and give such attention, you forget that they have many other sites and responsibilities. Attention to our challenges and complete dedication to assisting us in overcoming those challenges."

Another site liked the teamwork approach CTI provides, writing, "Your people have experience in clinical areas of the studies, come from hospitals and clinics, and appear to have open access to medical monitor for assistance when needed. Your company appears transparent and seems to have "open doors" between levels of study management - i.e. less bureaucracy, superior results."

Site personnel were honest in their comments about issues and suggested improvements, which were directly given to those managing global clinical operations at CTI. Our management will be working to continually improve communication with sites and expand training, among other items.
